2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•All theory and practical courses were completed through Online mode. College has subscribed the G-Suite Platform which facilitated the Online mode of teaching.</li> <li>•All faculty and students have domain specific email ids (xyz@sjipr.edu.in) which enabled a secure network for the process.</li> <li>•The G-Suite application – Google Meet was the online platform for conducting the sessions.</li> <li>•Google Slides, Google Docs and Google Sheets were used for sharing content through Google Meet during the lectures.</li> <li>•Jam Board App was the interactive board used for online teaching especially for subjects like mathematics, chemistry and numerical topics.</li> <li>•Faculty also created recorded sessions for difficult topics using various Video making Apps.</li> <li>•During the initial period of Lockdown several practical experiments were conducted using virtual laboratory experiments available in the public domain. After October 2020 when Lockdown was partially lifted, a few faculty staying near the college were able to visit the college laboratories. These faculties performed the experiments in the laboratories and recorded the same. These recorded versions were then shared through Google Meet sessions for students to explain the Practical concepts. These videos recorded in our own laboratories helped students to understand better as they were familiar with the set-up of the laboratory.</li> <li>•All theory and practical sessions conducted using Google Meet are recorded and recordings are available in the college domain.</li> <li>•Recorded content is made available to students so they can go through and revise at their convenience.</li> <li>•Google Classroom has been used as platform for sharing content with students. All presentations, documents, videos etc are shared with students using Google Classroom in a systematic and orderly manner. A separate classroom is created for each theory and practical.</li> <li>•Assignments and Quizzes have been periodically conducted using the Google Classroom. This has facilitated the Continuous Evaluation Process.</li> <li>•All Online examinations with MCQs were conducted using Google Forms with Autoproctor. Google Meet was used as the visual mode of invigilation.</li> <li>•From administrative point of view the Google Meet Logs were downloaded and programmed to be uploaded the Campus Management Information System (MIS). This enabled us to maintain the attendance records of students. Faculty could also upload their Lesson Plans and map their lectures for Syllabus Completion.</li> <li>•The Online Platform enabled us to invite Guest Speakers from far-off places to interact with students and keep them updated with the developments in the pharmaceutical industry.</li> <li>•Overall the syllabus was completed well and in a systematic manner.</li> </ul> <p>Currently syllabus is being completed by offline mode</p>
